



- Cartels priority No.1
- Increasing number of dawn raids and leniency applications
- Abuse cases predominantly in regulated sectors
- Decrease in notified mergers
- First decision on penalty for non-implemented merger commitments




Proceedings currently in progress

Leniency applications




II. Bid rigging

- Majority of cartel cases
- Cooperation with tendering authorities, police
- Cooperation with Faculty of Economics
- New punishment prohibition to participate in tenders for three years
- Crime; leniency application decriminalised

III. Recent Jurisprudence

- Litoměřice (2013)
 - Military dormitories tender for services
 - Agreement of five bidders
 - Evidence legally acquired by the police may be used in antitrust proceedings
 - Profit of the cartelists needs not be established

Recent Jurisprudence

Sokolovská uhelná (2013)

- □ Vertical agreements prohibiting exports, 1997 2009
- Interal restructuring of the undertaking in 2007
- The successor cannot bear liability for conduct prior to 1 May 2004 (unless the restructuring was deceitful)
- Evolution of the Petrol Distribution Cartel case (2009)
 - Succession of liability not permisible, unless specificly legislated for
 - The situation might by different after 1 May 2004

IV. Future Enforcement

- Higher number of issued bid rigging decisions
- Continuous trend in initiated proceedings and down raids
- More abuse cases outside regulated sectors
- New guidelines on setting fines
